
Celebrate Your AMERICAN LEGION!

1.Changes to ByLaws

In Article V, Section 4, the end of the paragraph:

- "...The Finance Officer shall share fiduciary responsibility in the business of the Post and shall chair any investment committee." <u>Strike the words "...and shall chair any invest-</u> <u>ment committee."</u>
- ARTICLE VIII—APPOINTMENTS Section 1. The Post Commander, immediately upon taking office each year, shall appoint the following standing committees: Membership, House, Finance, <u>{Investment,}</u> Legal, Rehabilitation, Americanism, Athletic and Child Welfare. Such standing committees shall consist of such members, and the chairman there-of, as shall be designated by the Post Commander.
- ARTICLE XI—RULES OF ORDER Section 1. All proceedings of this Post shall be conducted <u>{under}</u> pursuant to Roberts' Rules of Order, except as herein otherwise provided.

2.Changes to Standing rules

• 6. Post will reimburse delegates up to \$25.00 for meals per day and \$75.00 per day for lodging while at Department Convention. Maximum of 3 days. Receipts are required.f


