
### Chaplain's Corner



Thanksgiving and holiday season:






Psalms 69:30 "I will praise the name of God with a song, I will magnify Him with thanksgiving."

Hello Members,

Merry Christmas, to you all. Whether you will have a large Christmas gathering, a simple dinner for two or somewhere in between, I hope you're all healthy and happy.

Our December meeting will be a fun one. We are having a white elephant gift exchange. The monetary limit is \$10. Please come and join in on the fun and don't forget to wear your mask.

As we head into the cold winter season, I would like to offer a very simple vegetable soup recipe that Harold and I enjoy. It's a great way to add some nutritious, healthy veggies into your diet.



Vegetable Soup

2 onions sliced

1/2 to 1 leek sliced, (depending on what you prefer)

3 carrots chopped

2 cups of cherry tomatoes, sliced in half

3 cups of sweet peppers (de-seeded and coarsely chopped) (We get ours from Costco.

They are in a bag in the produce cooler area.)

1 butternut squash, peeled and cubed

1 acorn squash, peeled and cubed.

Toss all with olive oil and lightly salt and pepper. Spread onto a cookie sheet/s. Roast contents at 475 degrees, in a preheated oven, for 15 minutes.

Transfer the contents into a slow cooker and add:

\*\*Approx 3 cups of vegetable broth

1 cup heavy whipping cream

Cook on low setting for 3 hours. When done, purée the soup. (We use an immersion blender but it can be done in a blender as well.) Season to taste. We prefer Johnny's Seasoning Salt.

\*This soup is very easily tweaked. Use whatever vegetables your family prefers. Experiment with different vegetables.

\*\*If you prefer your soup to be thinner, add more broth, if you like it to be more bisque like, use less.
