Chaplains Corner - March 2021

Once again it is my sad duty to report that a long-time member of our Post, Walter R. Kennedy has been promoted to Post Everlasting. Walt passed on Friday February 5, 2021 at about 5pm in the evening. Walt was born on October 8, 1931 in Canton, MS. He is



survived by his wife of 32 years, Anne Kennedy of Gaston, Oregon. Though they had no children together, Anne told me Walt always claimed her four children, from a previous marriage, as his own. They have 4 grandchildren, and 2 great grandchildren Walt was a member of the United States Army. He served as a medic in Korea and an engineer in the states from 1949 until completing his career as a staff sergeant in 1959. Walt chose to become a medic while serving in Korea because he decided he didn't want to carry a rifle. Walt was awarded the Silver Star for saving the life of a wounded soldier and manning that soldiers machine gun all night against the North Koreans. Interestingly, Walt was also what is known as an "Atomic Veteran" having been present during 5 different above-ground nuclear bomb tests. Walt was a PUFL (paid up for life) member of the American Legion.

As of this writing the date of his memorial service has yet to be determined. I will inform everyone via this newsletter once I have that information.

The American Legion School Award Medal Program for High School Seniors

Objectives of the American Legion School Award Medal Program:

Place emphasis on the development of the qualities of

COURAGE, HONOR, LEADERSHIP, PATRIOTISM, SCHOLARSHIP, and SERVICE.

Developing ideals of Americanism among young people making them

citizens of the highest type.

Give recognition through the award of American Legion School Award Medals to the boy or girl who are deemed most worthy of the high qualities of citizenship and of true Americanism.

The Award Medal represents the educational symbolism of the School Award Medal Program and associates it with The American Legion and its purposes. The medal is applicable for award to either boys or girls in the graduating class of senior high schools.

Up to one senior will be selected from Century, Glencoe, Hillsboro, and Liberty High Schools each year to receive special recognition.

Each awardee receives a \$100, a certificate and a medal with the six qualities listed on the face of the medal, as the back bears the Marine Corps motto, "Semper Fidelis" ("always faithful").

Requirements:

- Must be a Senior in good standing attending one of the four local high schools Century, Glencoe, Hillsboro, or Liberty
- Must be a U.S. Citizen
- Complete Application identifying your six qualities that define character: courage, honor, leadership, patriotism, scholarship and service.

Legion Baseball

Baseball! The 2021 Post 6 Barbers AAA team needs our support! Coach Joe Duran tells me that the team has lost 2 of its 4 business sponsors this season due to economic conditions. Businesses are having a hard time staying afloat and funding for the team is suffering. He has asked for help from the Post to pay the teams registration fee of \$600 and any other financial support we can muster to help with insurance and the cost of uniforms. The team is wearing uniforms that were purchased in 2011 and they are wearing thin. There is also an issue with Ron Tonkin field. They will not be providing use of their facility this season and the team will need to find alternate fields for games that were scheduled for that site. Joe said the school district will rent their fields for \$100/hour and it costs \$150 for umpires. A three-hour game will run a minimum of \$450.00.
