
#### EARLY BIRD DINNER UPDATE

Hillsboro Post 6 competition will be held January 5, 2022. Specific time to be announced. Contestants must contact Hillsboro Post 6 at <a href="https://hillsboropostno.6@gmail.com">hillsboropostno.6@gmail.com</a> by December 22<sup>nd</sup> to be assigned a time slot.

Every contestant must begin at the Post level; only Post level winners will advance to the District Contest. The District contest winner will advance to the Department contest. The winner of the Department contest will represent Oregon in the National contest in Indianapolis, Indiana, usually held in April. The money available for scholarships at the Department level are:

**Department Level: 1st place:** \$5000

**2nd place:** \$3500 **3rd place:** \$2500

4th place: \$2000

National: 1<sup>st</sup> place: \$20,000



Speaking subjects must be on some aspect of the U.S. Constitution, with some emphasis on the duties and obligations of citizens to our government. Speeches are eight to 10 minutes long; three- to five-minute speeches on an assigned topic also are part of the contest.

#### \$50 Drawing at Our General Meeting! Recruit a Friend!


With the holidays here, it is time for a \$50 drawing at the Post! On Tuesday, Dec. 14<sup>th</sup> at
