Hillsboro Firefighter of The Year and The American Legion Department of Oregon Firefighter of the Year



Captain Brent Wellington

Firefighter of The Year (con.'t)

Captain Brent Wellington was selected as Hillsboro Firefighter of the Year for 2021. Brent is a third-generation firefighter and a second-generation firefighter at Hillsboro Fire and Rescue.

Brent began his career in November of 2001 as a firefighter/EMT basic. In mid-2000, he earned his EMT-intermediate license that expanded his scope of practice to provide care in emergency

medical situations. In 2005, he was assigned to work on an aerial fire truck where he initiated and managed the department's rope rescue program. In 2013, Brent was promoted to lieutenant and to captain in 2021.

Among his many contributions to the department, he served on the department's awards committee since its inception in 2011 and is currently its chairperson. He is an active contributor to the department's fire training group that helps identify, develop, and implement

training to the department. From the beginning of the technical rescue program, he has been an active member and discipline leader as a subject matter expert. Beyond his service to the community members in the City of Hillsboro, Brent's care and compassion reached a global scale. In 2003, he traveled to Honduras and spent six weeks building projects for an orphanage. Brent was recognized and awarded a Distinguished Unit Commendation by the Hillsboro Fire and Rescue for his participation in a technical rescue incident and his service deployment for Hurricane Katrina. He has received seven lifesaver awards throughout his distinguished career. In 2011, he was among a team from Hillsboro Fire and Rescue to travel with Medical Teams International to Cambodia to provide emergency medical services training to nurses and doctors-the first of many training trips the department partnered with MTI. In 2016, Brent spent time in Kenya, to provide technical rescue training to rescuers there.

Brent also won The American Legion Department of Oregon Firefighter of the Year. Brent is married to his wife Dena, and they have two sons, Cohen, and Easton.

The American Legion School Award Medal Program for High School Seniors

Objectives of the American Legion School Award Medal Program:

Place emphasis on the development of the qualities of COURAGE, HONOR, LEADERSHIP, PATRIOTISM, SCHOLARSHIP, and SERVICE. Developing ideals of Americanism among young people making them citizens of the highest type.

Give recognition through the award of American Legion School Award Medals to the boy or girl who are deemed most worthy of the high qualities of citizenship and of true Americanism.

The Award Medal represents the educational symbolism of the School Award Medal Program and associates it with The American Legion and its purposes. The medal is applicable for award to either boys or girls in the graduating class of senior high schools.

Up to four Seniors will be selected within the Hillsboro School District each year to receive special recognition.

Each awardee receives a \$100, a certificate and a medal with the six qualities listed on the face of the medal, as the back bears the Marine Corps motto, "Semper Fidelis" ("always faithful").
