The Auxiliary Helping Our Veterans

The Hillsboro American Legion Auxiliary has been busy helping our Veterans. We adopted a family from Oregon National Guard with the help of the Family Readiness Specialist. We were paired up with a single Mom with three children. We were able to purchase three gifts for each child and give the mother a \$200 gift card for anything else that the family needed. The family was able to attend our Ham Dinner where we gave the gifts to the family.

For years the Auxiliary has helped the Salvation Army Veterans and Family Center with a donation for extras for their Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners. This year we also were linked up with a mother with five children that was transitioning out of the Center into their own home. We were able to purchase two gifts for each of the family members and give the Mom a gift card to help with anything else that was needed. The Post also helped by giving additional gift cards for the family. We got the gifts delivered before the bad weather hit.

For the first time in three years, we were able to have Christmas Cheer at the Portland VA hospital. Christmas Cheer is a Department project that our Unit donates to yearly. Christmas Cheer is where we buy small gifts and put them in a Christmas stocking and give them to each hospitalized Veteran on the day they are delivered. This year we gave 77 stockings to our Veterans. This year one of our Unit members and one Post member was able to help with this project. Even the nursing staff was glad to see us back doing this.

This month we also donated money to P.A.V.E., a local non-profit that supplies and trains service dogs for Veterans, and we donated to the Liver and Kidney Transplant Unit connected to the Portland VA hospital. All of this is possible from our Poppy donations.
