I watched a movie over the summer called "The Guardian". It's about the Coast Guard Rescue swimmers. An older veteran nearing his retirement is tasked with training a new batch of recruits passing on his wisdom and experience as he trains the new prospective swimmers. One recruit is a far better swimmer than the rest and is rather arrogant about his superior skills. He announces his goal is to break every swimming and rescue record the older veteran holds. Eventually he matures and becomes a team player. One day he and the old veteran



are called on to attempt to rescue several men from a sinking fishing boat during a very bad storm. After rescuing all the fishermen, they are being hoisted up to safety but are putting an unbearable strain on the hoist that is bringing them up from the stormy sea. The winch can't handle the weight of them both and the cable begins to unravel. The veteran lets go of the grasp of the formerly arrogant recruit and falls to his death in the storm thereby saving the younger rescue swimmer.

It's a powerful story and it reminded me of our heavenly Father and His ultimate rescue of me, an arrogant sinner through the sacrificial gift of His Son. May I encourage us all to give that some serious thought?









